*This most generous God who gives seed to the farmer that becomes bread for your meals is more than extravagant with you. PASTOR'S THOUGHTS CONTINUED

Generosity is not a God thing alone. **God gives each of us something** that we can then give away. God gives us something so that we can **be generous in every way**. Generosity is **the Christian's superpower** because generosity comes directly from God.

This is true of money. Money is not an object that is separated from God's concern and care. How we spend our **money is as much a concern to God** as it is to our banker, our credit card lender, and the retailer. "Where your treasure is", Matthew wrote, "that's where your heart is also." (Matthew 6:21) How often do we think about our money in terms of abundance (how much do we have) rather than what's on our heart?

In order for Holy Trinity to grow into the future, **we must stop avoiding talk about money**. The priest Henri J.M. Nouwen once wrote, "fundraising is as spiritual as giving a sermon, entering a time of prayer, visiting the sick, or feeding the hungry ... fundraising has to help us with our conversion" (*The Spirituality of Fundraising*, pg. 21, 2010). If we were in a different time (perhaps when gold was used for exchange) or a different place (perhaps where barter is used for living), we might be right in avoiding money talk.

But, money is not personal alone. It is public. Money is not sacred alone. It is shared everywhere between people. Money is not material alone. **Like the heart, money reflects our spiritual conversation with God**. So long as we need money to live our lives, we need money to make the kingdom of God "up there" a reality "down here" on earth.

Women's Study Group

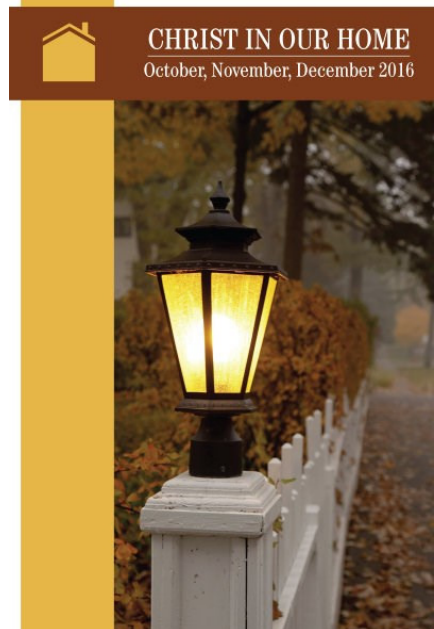

When? Wednesdays, April 19th—May 24th, 6:30—8:00pm

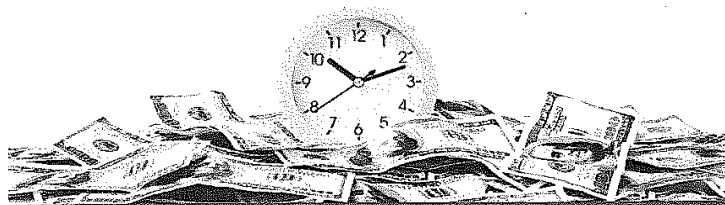
Who should attend? Any individual adult or couple who are co-spenders. High School students are welcome with a partner adult.
