Where will new members come from in 2017 and beyond?

Rethinking our past and looking forward to our future



In last month's Lamplighter, I showed the sources of growth of the congregation during Holy Trinity's second Golden Age in the early 2000s. Holy Trinity was vibrant, growing in membership, and felt full of new life.

This month, I will write about **the congregation life cycle** and why we **do not need to be anxious** over church decline.

There is no quick fix

One thing to keep in mind is that there is **no quick fix** to congregational growth. When there is anxiety in our church life - the loss of a pastor, the decline in membership, etc. - our first instinct is to get rid of the pain. "If we just get a new pastor, we will be stable again". "If we just get more youth into the building, we will grow again." "If we just get more volunteers, we will be able to do the things we used to do." Calling a pastor; growing youth programs; and signing up new volunteers are all important goals and strategies. Each one feels good because each helps ease our anxieties over losing membership and of, perhaps, one day closing the church. But, **those things are not solutions to problems of growth**.


PASTOR'S THOUGHTS CONTINUED

From JOY Society to Just an Older You

In the 1950s and 1960s, Holy Trinity hosted the JOY Society for Married Couples. To the best of anyone's memory, the JOY Society for Married Couples was a congregational ministry that focused on bringing together married couples to socialize and discuss issues of Christian marriage. Over the years, those couples matured, grew families, and experienced many life changes as they and their children got older. New groups formed, like the League of Young Adult Lutherans; the Young Adult Christians of Holy Trinity; and the Center for Seniors. Today, however, many of those who participated in one or more of those earlier groups now participate in Just an Older You - the JOY senior group. Over the years, ministries within the church change, evolve, and adapt over time. And that is because people change, evolve, and adapt over time. **JOY for young married couples in the 1960s is a different experience than JOY for older retired couples in the 2000s.**

Churches go through growth stages just as people go through growth stages

The image below is an illustration of the life stages of congregations:



A congregation's life cycle mimics changes we all experience in our lives. For example, when we are 18 and graduated from high school, we lose some of the freedoms of childhood. However, we redefine and redevelop our lives in our rebirth as young adults. Think about the changes you felt when you turned 18. Decline is a signal for new life in a congregation. When decline occurs - a decline in membership, a decline in volunteers, a decline in the number of years the average pastor serves - there are always opportunities for redefinition, redevelopment, and rebirth.

We at Holy Trinity are in the midst of a decline. That is normal. Now is a good time to be asking ourselves questions to help us grow into the future. Because you and I are the church, we can start asking personally these questions of ourselves:

How can I redefine my life in such a way that I can invite outsiders into the life of faith?

- What spiritual gifts do I need to nurture and develop to meet the needs of 21st century Toledo?
- What stories of new life and rebirth in times of loss in my life should I be sharing with the people around me?

2016 Synod Appeal Feeding Ministry Grant Program


As part of the E.L.C.A's five year "Always Being Made New" campaign, the Northwestern Ohio Synod conducted a concurrent synod appeal for a Feeding Ministry Grant Program. Gifts to this appeal through December 31, 2016 amounted to \$13,460.88. The Feeding Ministry Grant Program received 45 submissions which totaled \$85,000. The funding of any individual ministry was capped at \$1,000 due to a greater request for support than was given to the appeal.

On February 8, 2017, a special reception will be hosted by Bishop Daniel Beaudoin at the synod office to present checks to the recipients. Our Holy Trinity Food Pantry has been awarded \$250 and we are very thankful. (See the letter on the main bulletin board.)



GARDENS FOR GOD



"Who Is Your Farmer"

In today's culture we have let the corporate farms take over the production of food which in a lot of cases come from distant farms. This is a contributor to climate change being caused by fossil fuel

driven transportation. We used to have small family farms which produced produce, farm animals, eggs, milk and were sold, for the most part, at local farmer markets.

Toledo Grow, which is a part of the Toledo Botanical Garden, has a community garden program that is headquartered at the Oneida Drive greenhouse and gardens in North Toledo between Cherry and Lagrange Streets. This program provides plants and seeds for over 110 community gardens. You may not be aware that Holy Trinity has a community garden which is presently in Fred Heaney's back yard. The produce grown is used for his use and the majority is brought to the Food Pantry to be given to our clients.

We would like to explore two ideas to expand the idea of fresh food for ourselves as well as our pantry clients.

#1 Idea = Do you have room in your yard for a small garden? There are many different ways to have a garden.

4' X 8' raised beds

Containers

Fence line plots

Regular plots

If you are interested please let Fred know and we will meet to see how we can best help you get started.

#2 Idea = Community garden task force.

Form a task force to explore how we could form a community garden with other churches and/or other members of the community to grow fresh plants and flowers, etc. for ourselves and the community. If this is something that would interest you please notify the office and we can begin to plan.
