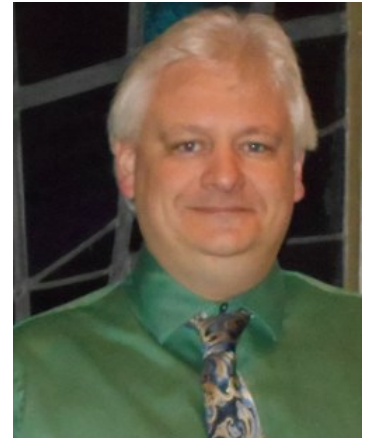

Where will our new members come from in 2017 and beyond?



This is another reflection in a series to help us think about vision and what Holy Trinity must prioritize in order to grow.

In the last Lamplighter, I discussed how decline in a congregation causes anxiety. However, decline in a congregation calls us to think about new ideas and new strategies for sharing the Good News. At the end of the article, I asked the following question: What stories of new life and rebirth in times of loss in my life should I be sharing with the people around me? **Stories of new life and rebirth in our lives help us visualize the new life and rebirth we seek in our church.**

Storytelling requires two things: one willing to speak, and one willing to listen. Another way of illustrating this is to ask, "What good is a story told if another is not listening, and what good is listening if there is no story to tell?" Our problem is not a shortage of stories. Our problem might be, however, a shortage of listening.

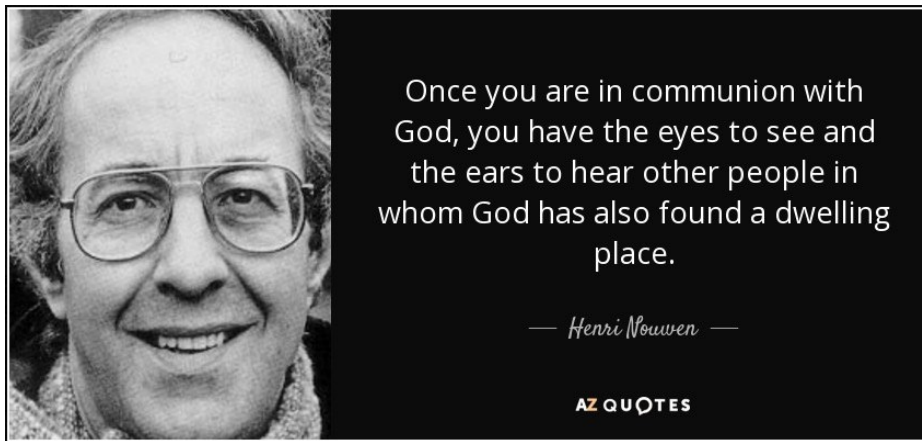

PASTOR'S THOUGHTS CONTINUED

In his classic book, *7 Habits of Highly Successful People*, Steven Covey observed that more often than not, **people listen in order to reply, but they don't listen in order to understand.** Think about those highly-charged political talk shows: the idea is to get people to react to the argument, but not to understand the argument.

For a variety of reasons, we often do this in our day to day conversations in much less hostile environments. Many things are going on in our minds and in our schedules, so it is difficult to hear the meaning behind the stories people tell us. For example, there are times when someone might be telling us of the sadness and pain in their lives. In our own struggle, **we might simply be planning our response:** "I am praying for you." It's not that we are bad people, or that we aren't feeling sympathy. But sometimes the painful stories of another person become painful to us. In a time when deep understanding is needed, it is easier to simply provide a courteous reply.



Too often, in the anxiety of decline, congregations seek information from people to find the quick fix program to solve problems. The decline causes pain, so a quick fix becomes attractive to avoid the pain. By and large, however, people don't make their best decisions from information to information. **We make our best decisions from story to story.** We must be willing to **tell our faith story** to others; we must be willing to **listen to the faith stories of other people.**

How would our ministry change **if we listened to the stories of the tutoring students?**

How would our ministry change **if we listened to the stories of the day care families?**

How would our ministry change **if we listened to the stories of the people who use our food pantry?**

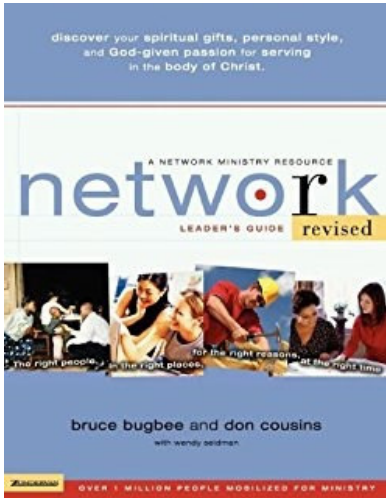
How would our ministry change **if we listened to the stories of our confirmation students?**

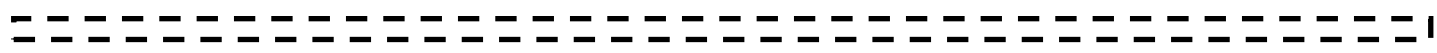

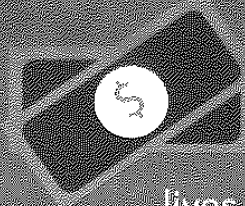

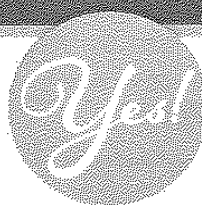
