Pastoral Ponderings

WOW...It's September. Summertime is over. Where did it go? Time flies, they say, when you're having fun.

Welcome to the fall, September, and getting back into the swing of things. What follows here is a short list of things that I think it would be good for everyone to ponder.

- 1) Don't expect the church to entertain your kids...I knew of a church in my last location that everyone said was fun. Yet the young people did not learn the books of the Bible, the Ten Commandments or the Apostles' Creed. They did not have service projects or prayer. But what they did have was inflatables, coffee, donuts, pop. People thought, "Well at least they are going to church." But the real question should have been, **WAS THE CHURCH DOING WHAT THE CHURCH OUGHT TO BE DOING?** Was the church teaching the young people the great statements and symbols of the church? Was the church teaching the great statements of Jesus, the Prince of Peace? Was the church offering a distinctive model for living life? Or was the church just interested in numbers, getting people in the door, being spectacular rather than being a servant? I don't think that church and

the happenings of the church ought to be boring, but don't expect the church to just entertain. This church will teach and will worship and will serve because we are called to teach, we are called to worship, and we are called to serve.

- 2) You might start seeing a **FEW LITTLE CHANGES** here. I have been here seven months and I am thrilled at what Holy Trinity Lutheran Church is and does. I hope that in the seven months you have also grown to appreciate that I am here to be your pastor, your worship leader, your preacher, and to be one of you. All I want to do is to improve on what is here, to have it evolve, not just to change for change sake. So you might see some minor changes, like the order of worship might be changed slightly, the Baptismal font might be moved to reflect how central it is in our Lutheran faith, and we are going to add a new worship setting to our tool kit so that worship isn't always the same. We will teach these things so that they become familiar, so that they become part of who we are. Whenever a new Pastor shows up on the church scene, there are little changes. I hope that they will be helpful for you.
- 3) **WE NEED MEN**...I hope that you do think of me as a sexist. I hope that you will hear me out and think of the end result

Our pictorial directory is now taking shape. We will have sign up in the lounge each Saturday and Sunday in September. The pictures will be taken on October 1, 2 and 3.



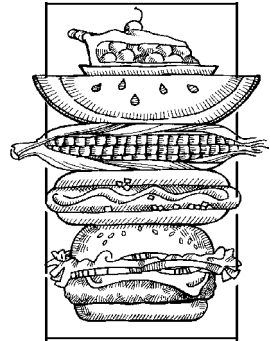

and not take this personally. A couple of studies that I had seen in my earlier years in the ministry showed how important it is for men to be involved in church and the Christian upbringing of their children. The figures were amazing. If the dad is involved in church, there is a 75%- 80% chance that the children will be involved in church after their catechism years. But if dad is not involved, there is less than a 30% chance for that same teenager to be involved in church. Mom, many times, will be the spiritual instructor, but the example of Dad is so very important. That is why I like to have men involved in Vacation Bible School and in Sunday School, even if they are simply walking around and are visible. It is even better if dad is teaching. So, we need men: men to be in worship, men to be in Sunday School, men to be visible, men to tell our children how very important and wonderful they are, men to work around the building. I hope you get the point. We

need men to be involved and visible so that Holy Trinity can do what it is called to do.

- 4) Women, you know that much of what the church does is reflective of who you are and what you do. Thank you for that and please keep on keeping on.
- 5) We ought and can start expecting 200 people in worship on any given weekend and we ought to see 100 people in Sunday School each Sunday. These are numbers that just might be a bit of a challenge, but they are markers and goals for us to strive for. These figures involve each and every one of us. Holy Trinity needs your prayers, your participation, your invitations, and your presence so that we can reach and do what God has called us to do.

The Eleventh Biennial Churchwide Assembly of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) was held Aug. 17-23, 2009, at the Minneapolis Convention Center. About 2,300 people participated, including 1,045 voting members. The theme was “God’s work. Our hands.” Below is a brief summary of actions from the assembly.

Full Communion with the United Methodist Church Adopted

By a vote of 958-51, the assembly adopted a full communion agreement with the United Methodist Church (UMC). This is the ELCA’s sixth full-communion relationship and the first for the UMC. The assembly also established a joint commission to oversee the relationship by a vote of 922-15. In 2008 the UMC General Conference adopted the same proposal.

Carlos Peña Re-elected Vice President

Vice President Carlos Peña of Galveston, Texas, was elected on the fourth ballot to a second six-year term as vice president with 580 votes, 60.8 percent of the votes cast. Peña was elected over Ryan M. Schwarz, McLean, Va., who received 264 votes, and Norma J. Hirsch, Des Moines, Iowa, who received 110 votes. There were 97 nominees on the first ballot.

HIV and AIDS Funding Proposal Adopted

The assembly voted 884-41 to approve a proposal to raise \$10 million over three years to support this church’s HIV and AIDS strategy. A \$1 million goal encouraged by the 2007 Churchwide Assembly will be included in the \$10 million. The ELCA Church Council approved the strategy in March.

Development of Lutheran Malaria Initiative Approved

By a vote of 989-11, the assembly approved continued development of an initiative to fight malaria, particularly in Africa. The Lutheran Malaria Initiative (LMI) is a shared effort with Lutheran World Relief (LWR), The Lutheran Church-Missouri

Synod (LCMS) and the United Nations Foundation. The assembly authorized continued receipt of gifts designated for the LMI, and asked that a report and recommendations for a possible churchwide LMI campaign be brought to the 2011 assembly.

Social Statement, “Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust,” Adopted

The assembly adopted by a vote of 676-338 -- precisely two-thirds of those voting -- “Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust,” the ELCA’s 10th social statement, with editorial amendments. It also adopted 15 implementing resolutions by a vote of 695-285. The social statement is a theological and teaching document that builds on the key Lutheran principles of justification by grace and Christian freedom to serve the neighbor. It emphasizes that central to our vocation, in relation to human sexuality, is the building and protection of trust in relationships. It therefore affirms that we are called to be trustworthy in our human sexuality and to build social institutions and practices in which trust and trustworthy relationships can thrive. The social statement addresses, among other topics, marriage, same-gender relationships, families, protecting children, friendships, commitment, social responsibility and moral discernment. Regarding same-gender committed relationships, the social statement recognizes that members of this church are not in agreement and identifies the different perspectives that are present among us.

Ministry Policies Resolutions Adopted

Voting members adopted resolutions proposed by the Church Council based on those contained in a "Report and Recommendation on Ministry Policies." The assembly determined on August 17 that majority votes were required on each resolution for adoption. The actions direct that changes be made to churchwide policy documents to make it possible for people in publicly accountable, lifelong, monogamous, same-gender relationships to serve as rostered leaders in the ELCA. The assembly adopted the resolutions in the following order:

Resolution 3: Adopted by a vote of 771-230 as amended: "Resolved, that in the implementation of any resolutions on ministry policies, the ELCA commit itself to bear one another's burdens, love the neighbor, and respect the bound consciences of all."

Resolution 1: Adopted by a vote of 619-402: "Resolved, that the ELCA commit itself to finding ways to allow congregations that choose to do so to recognize, support and hold publicly accountable lifelong, monogamous, same-gender relationships."

Resolution 2: Adopted by a vote of 559-451: "Resolved, that the ELCA commit itself to finding a way for people in such publicly accountable, lifelong, monogamous, same-gender relationships to serve as rostered leaders of this church."

Resolution 4: Adopted by a vote of 667-307 as amended: This resolution called upon members to respect the bound consciences of those with whom they disagree; declared the intent to allow structured flexibility in decision-making about candidacy and the call process; eliminated the prohibition of rostered service by members in publicly accountable, lifelong, monogamous same-gender relationships; recognized and committed to respect the conviction of members who believe that the ELCA should not call or roster people in committed same-gender relationships;

called for development of accountability guidelines; directed that appropriate amendments to ministry policy documents be drafted and approved by the Church Council; and urged that this church continue to trust congregations, bishops, synods and others responsible for determining who should be called into public ministry.

Budget Proposals for 2010, 2011 Adopted

By a vote of 863-71 voting members adopted churchwide budget proposals for 2010 and 2011. For 2010, voting members approved a current fund income proposal of \$76.69 million for the churchwide organization and an ELCA World Hunger Appeal income proposal of \$18.7 million. For 2011, they approved a current income proposal of \$76.78 million and a World Hunger income goal of \$19 million.

Social Statement on Justice for Women to be Developed

By a vote of 754-176 the assembly approved development of a social statement on the topic, to be considered by the 2015 Churchwide Assembly.

Ways To Minister From Social Ministry

Ever wonder how you could help someone with just a simple act? Well, Social Ministry has several ongoing ways that you can!

- † **Aluminum Cans**—Cans are sold at recycle Company and money is deposited in the Youth Ministry account to be used for youth projects (bring cans to rear entrance of church at bottom of staircase, by the pop machine).
- † **Used Stamps** – save postage stamp from envelopes received in the mail. These stamps are taken to Hampton Park Church where they soak the stamp off of the paper. Then they send the stamp to a stamp processor who returns a check to Hampton Park and they forward the money to the Heiffer Project. This organization provides animals to poor families throughout the world .These animals provide an income for them and in most cases provide food (drop stamps at office or put in an envelope and drop in the offering plate).
- † **Retired Cell Phones & Ink Jet and Copier Cartridges**--These item are taken to Habitat For Humanity Office and they sell them to recycle companies. The money is used for Habitat For Humanity Projects (deposit phones and cartridges in box next to the elevator on main floor).
- † **Feed Your Neighbor** – bring in non-perishable food items to church to help those in need in our area.
